

# DICOT COASTERS

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One shuttle project

These coasters measure about 3.5" across when made in size 10 thread. I use them under hot drinks as they are, but for cold drinks that "sweat" you might waterproof with polyurethane or some such. If you're really serious, cast them in resin.

Skill level: Beginner

Skills needed: Rings, Chains, Regular joins

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This pattern proceeds in two rounds. Reverse work as normal between ring and chain elements.

Begin round 1 with Ring A.

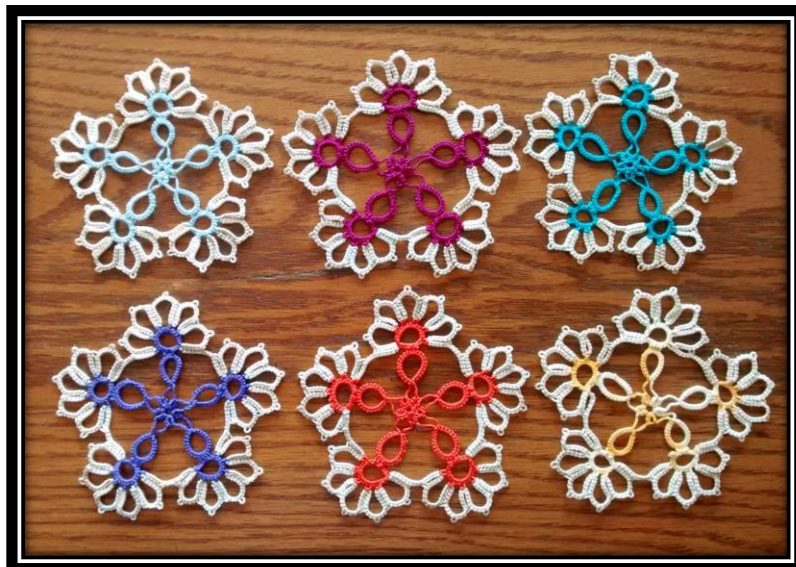
Leave a space of bare thread (1/4" if using size 10 thread). Then work Ring B. Finish with Ring B, then knot end to the base of Ring A, leaving bare thread space, and hide end.

Begin round 2 with Ring C.

Work Chain D five times, then Chain E.

Repeat four more times starting with Ring C. End with Chain 5, tie to base of first Ring C, and hide ends.

Starch and press lightly. Waterproof as desired.
